Rules for Admission of NRI/ PIO/ Foreign Students in Different Academic Programmes being offered in UTDs

Categories:

1. Non Resident Indian (NRI) or NRI Sponsored:

As per Income Tax Act, 1961 an individual is non-resident for income tax purpose, when he/she is not a resident or who is not ordinarily resident. A person is treated as ordinarily resident when any of the following conditions is satisfied.

(i) If he/she has not been resident of India in nine out of ten preceding years: or

(ii) If he/she has not been in India for a period of 730 days or more during the preceding seven years.

Candidates who are seeking admission against seats reserved for non-resident Indians subject to the following conditions:

a. At least one of the parents of such candidates should be non-resident Indian and shall ordinarily be residing abroad as non-resident Indian;

b. The person who sponsors the candidate for admission should be a first degree relation of the candidate and should be ordinarily residing abroad as a non-resident Indian;

c. If the candidate has no parents or near relatives or taken as a ward by some other nearest relative such candidate may also be considered for admission provided that the guardian has bonafidely treated the candidate as a ward and such guardian shall file an affidavit indicating the interest shown in the education affairs of the candidate and also his relationship with the candidate and such person also should be a non-resident Indian and ordinarily residing abroad.

2. Persons of Indian Origin (PIO):

PIOs are such persons who are citizens of other Countries (except Pakistan & Bangladesh) who at any time held an Indian Passport, or who or either of his parents or any of his grandparents was a citizen of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Sec 2(b) of Citizenship Act, 1955(Act No. 57 of 1955).

3. Foreign Nationals:

Citizens of all countries other than who are not of Indian origin as defined under PIO. Foreign student in this context shall be defined as the student who possesses the foreign passport. Foreign students are further categorized as follows:

3.1 Students from SAARC other than India:

The students having citizenship of Maldives, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Afghanistan are considered in this category.

3.2 Students from BIMSTEC other than India:

The students having citizenship of Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Thailand are considered in this category.

Seats:

- i. No seat is reserved for the students of any of the above mentioned categories in M.E./ M.Tech./ M.Pharm./ B.Pharm./B.A.LL.B. programmes.
- ii. 5% seats of the total seats are available for NRI/ NRI sponsored candidates in each programme, except the programmes mentioned above in (i).
- iii. 15% seats, over and above, of the sanctioned intake are available for Foreign nationals/ PIOs in each programme, except the programmes mentioned above in (i).

Fees:

- i. For NRI/ NRI Sponsored/ PIO/ Foreign Nationals Belong to SAARC or BIMSTEC:
The fee will be additional 50% or Rs. 20,000 per semester (whichever is less) of existing fee applicable to Indian students.
If existing fee per semester for Indian students is < Rs. 40,000 then fee chargeable to the students of above mentioned category (i) will be 1.5 times of the existing fee.
If existing fee per semester for Indian students is \geq Rs. 40,000 then fee chargeable to the students of above mentioned category (i) will be Rs. 20,000 more than the existing fee.
- ii. Foreign Nationals Belong to other than SAARC or BIMSTEC:
Annual fee will be USD 3500.

Caution Money (Refundable) and Alumni Fee:

Eligibility:

The minimum eligibility for admission will be same as for Indian students.

Admission Criteria:

Direct admissions will be given to the students of all above mentioned categories without any entrance test subject to fulfilling minimum eligibility criteria of the programme.

The candidates belong to above mentioned categories should apply to the “Chairperson, UTD Admission Cell, DAVV” separately in the prescribed format.

The admission will be confirmed if the candidate fulfills the following conditions:

- (a) Possesses eligibility certificate issued by the University.
- (b) Deposited the requisite registration / renewal fee and immigration fee.
- (c) Produces original passport and valid student visa.
- (d) Certificate from the competent Medical Officer that the candidate is not HIV positive or suffering from AIDS.
- (e) Certificate from District Administration / Police Department that candidate name has been enrolled in the register of foreign nationals.
- (f) Produces original certificates of qualifying examinations.

If the candidate fulfills all the requirements of admission, the University shall issue provisional admission letter to him/her and inform the concerned Indian High Commission/ Embassy. On the basis of the provisional admission letter, the Indian High Commission/ Embassy will issue a student visa to enable the student to come to India and join the University. It will be the sole responsibility of the student to seek admission in the concerned program within the time limit prescribed for admissions.

The eligibility certificate and other documents will be issued to the candidate in person, on producing valid evidence of identity. The student should necessarily present himself/ herself. The certificates will not be granted and issued to his agents/ representatives/ friends etc.
