

Admission, results & A+ grade for varsity on VC's priority list

'Target Now Is To Revamp The System'

Indore: Right on Day-1, new vice-chancellor of Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya Dr Renu Jain set her priorities straight — streamlining admission process, timely declaration of results and NAAC visit. The new VC took charge on Friday and gave a clear message that days of deadlock are over with the target now is revamping the system and improving quality of education.

"My priority will be to streamline admission process, ensure timely declaration of results and get the varsity ready for NAAC visit," said Dr Jain adding that as August 14 is last date for admission a meeting of head of departments (HODs) has been scheduled on Saturday to take a decision on Common Entrance Test (CET) type 1. The admissions have be-

en halted for over a month. "For forthcoming National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) visit, I will review all preparations. If there is any gap, the visit will be postponed," Dr Jain told mediapersons.

She added that improving education and research work is the ultimate target and efforts will be made in this regard to make DAVV go up the ladder.

Dr Jain, who is the first woman VC of DAVV, expressed gratitude towards Governor and state government for giving her such an important responsibility. "I have been assigned an important responsibility by Governor and state government. I will try my best to live up to the expectations," Dr Jain said.

After taking charge, Dr Jain met former executive council member of Rajiv Gandhi Pradyogiki Vishwavidyalaya (RGPV) Ajay Chordia, who was sitting on hunger strike from July 15 over delay in appointment of VC and made him break his fast.
