India committed to SDGs in education, health & poverty eradication: DAVV V-C

IIPS-CoMET 2025 on Accelerating Progress Towards

The conference commenced with an inaugural address by CEO of Atypical Advantage, Vineet Saraiwala, who highlighted challenges faced by disabled individuals in employment. His enter-
