

DAVV to make seniors tech-savvy

Indore: After analyzing that a section of people especially the seniors have been facing a lot of job-related issues due to lack of technological knowledge, Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya (DAVV) has decided to roll out a certificate course to assist them.

Besides the basic concepts, candidates will also be taught free tools available on the internet which can be useful for office work which they might now be aware about.

DAVV's Deen Dayal Upadhyay Kaushal Kendra (DDU-KK) has planned a month-long course to assist them for long run.

of pandemic has forced everyone to work from home and in this process many upper age people have been forced to make use of technology which they are not well-versed with. We have planned this course for them," director of Deen Dayal Upadhyay Kaushal Kendra, Dr Maya Ingle told TOI.

There is no eligibility criteria for the course, the candidates will have to get

registered with a nominal fee and the classes will be for five days a week.

This will be a blended classroom with both offline and online mode of studies and will begin from last week of July.

"Depending upon the candidates, we will begin classes in a blended mode. We shall call less than 10 candidates at a time and maintain all the precautionary measures of Covid to

train them, thereafter, train through online mode," said Ingle.

The department has been focusing on skill-based courses and has also planned to roll out a few more courses especially after the Atma-nirbhar campaign such as how to become an entrepreneur, there will be MVoc course of landscape designing which will play an essential role now due to this situation, she added.
