### Dress for success: Interview attire

The focus is to look clean cut and professional by sticking to a classic look. Wear Interview Attire to any meeting or event where first impressions are extremely important.

- Black, navy, and dark grey suits with little or no pattern

- Simple ties with minimal patterns and tame colors





### TIES :
















Choose a color that coordinates with your trousers (<u>usually</u> <u>black, dark gray, dark brown, or dark blue</u>) Make sure they are <u>long enough not to expose your skin when you sit down.</u> As a thumb rule, do not wear white socks. Wear clean socks to avoid bad odour









Wear a good pair of leather shoes- black and brown/tan shoes.

Shoes must be polished everyday.



Do not wear shoes that look casual. Do not wear shoes with worn out heels.

# Shoes

- Well-repaired heels
- Always clean and polished Make it a habit to wipe your shoes clean each time you go to the rest room to freshen up
- Laces tied neatly at all times
- Socks should be clean
- Shoes that are provided by the hotel should be worn within the hotel at all times, while on duty





Wear only formal belts with a sleek buckle. As thumb rule, match your belt to your shoes.

### Watches :

Preferably wear leather strapped watches. If you wear a metal strapped watch, make sure that it fits the wrist well.









# Hair

- Clean, neatly cut and not extending below the ears It should be at or above the collar line of the uniform or shirt
- Always well combed
- Frequently shampooed
- Kept in place, but not oily
- Crowning glory
- Keep it at length
- For males should have hair cut from time to time and no long hair



## Face

- Clean-shaven No stubble beard or moustache. well trimmed, above lip level and not drooping
- Teeth must be brushed clean without nicotine stains
- Sideburns are to not be longer than half the length of each ear



# Hands

- Regularly washed
- No marks or nicotine stains
- Nails are to be short, clean, of even length and well trimmed

# Accessories

- Restricted to a single ring
- Necklaces, if worn, are not to be visible
- Earrings are not to be worn by male associates
- Limit accessories to 3 pieces
- Avoid bracelets, necklaces and visible piercing
- Include watch, ring and handkerchief

# 3. What are the do's and don'ts for professional dressing?

- Do's
- Business suits
- Skirts: the length should hit just above or below the knee or below the ankle.
- Slacks: neatly pressed, nothing too tight
- Blouses: Dressy styles or button-down shirts paired with a cardigan or blazers.
- Dresses: worn alone, or with a suit jacket or blazer
- Shoes: closed-toe, polished, scuff-free.
- Jewelry: tasteful and simple, not overdone.

# What are to do's and don'ts for professional dressing? Cont.....

- Don't
- Anything too short, too revealing, too tight or too sheer.
- Blouses that are sleeveless or low-cut.
- Casual wears like Jeans, shorts, summer dresses.
- Casual khaki pants (neutral or khaki-colored dress slacks are OK).
- Open-toed or overly casual shoes (flip flops), or those with extremely high heels.



### What to wear?

You may wear\_salwaar kameez or formal shirt/trousers You may wear a tunic with a pair of formal trousers. Preferably choose small prints or self colors.





Avoid plunging necklines, sleeveless and tight fitting clothes



### SHOES/SANDAL :

Shoes with 1 ½ - inch heels are standard. You may wear a pair with smaller heels or a flat pair. Stick with a black/brown pair. Be sure your shoes are polished and that your heels are intact.







### Do not wear colorful sandals



Avoid heels and sandals with bling



Avoid white colored sandals as they get dirty easily. If you do, clean them well.





# Shoes

- Low heeled are appropriate with most clothes
- Shoes are not to reveal your heels or toes









### BAGS :

Apart from your working bag if you are carrying an additional bag, preferably, carry a black or a brown one







## ACCESSORIES :

Earrings : Wear stubs or small rings







#### Do not wear hoops or dangling earrings









### **Bracelets/Bangles:**

You may wear either a bracelet or a bangle. Avoid both.





### Rings / Chains:

Rings: Keep them simple and not chunky. Chains: You may wear thin chains with small lockets.



### Do not wear ornamental/ chunky jewelry.

## Hair

- Hair should be left open only if it is above shoulder length While at work it should be away from the face

- Hair styles to suit your face
- Females tie your hair with hair pulled back from face
- Should be well groomed

# Day make-up

- Should be light, subtle and carefully applied Light to medium shades
- e g Pinks, peaches and russets should be used
- Blush-on on the cheek bones and along the neck is a must It enhances your features
- Should be natural looking
- Mild fragrance
- Nail paints and lip color should not be too trendy or bright
- Avoid extremely dark, bright reds and fluorescent colors



# Eye make-up

- A light application of mascara, a light shade of eye shadow or alternately a khol application
- Dark shades of eye shadows e g Brown, pink, red should be avoided during the day time
- Dark circle should be covered with under eye make up



# Hands

- Hands should always be clean and well-manicured Use of mehendi on hands or any part of the body is not permitted
- Nails should be well shaped with a light to medium colour application of nail polish Nail polish should not be chipped
- Extremely long nails, enamelled with very bright or dark shades of nail polish are not allowed

# Accessories

- Earrings to be restricted to one pair and should be discreet i e ear studs and ear loops no longer than 1/2"
- Only a simple thin necklace may be worn but should not be visible
- Nose rings and anklets are not to be worn
- No brooches or accessories; or anything that is not part of the uniform should be worn
- It is recommended that a simple watch be worn on duty
- Only two rings on one hand or a maximum of three rings on both hands may be worn
- Only one light gold bangle or bracelet may be worn
- Keep minimal and conservative
- 5 piece rule
