

Ordinance No. 241

**Bachelor of Engineering (Part Time Degree Course)
in Mechanical/ Computer/ Electronics & Instrumentation/
Information Technology/ Electronics & Telecommunication/ Civil Engineering
Under Faculty of Engineering DAVV, Indore**

1. Name of Program:

Bachelor of Engineering (Part Time Degree Course) in Mechanical/Computer/Electronics & Instrumentation/Information Technology/Electronics & Telecommunication/Civil Engineering

2. Name of Faculty and Board of Studies:

Faculty of Engineering - Board of Study of the respective branch of Engineering.

3. Duration:

Part time program shall comprise of the course of study spread over a period of four years i.e. eight semesters. The maximum duration of the course shall be eight (08) years i.e. sixteen (16) semesters.

4. Eligibility and admission process:

- (i) A candidate seeking admission to the program should be a working professional and have minimum 50% marks (45% for SC/ST) in Diploma (approved by the appropriate statutory body) in relevant branch or B.Sc. with Mathematics as one Subject from a recognized University.
- (ii) The candidate must have two years of job experience.
- (iii) Admission to the program shall be made through an open advertisement. The mode of selection shall be as decided by the University.

5. Fee Structure:

- (i) The fees structure shall be approved by the University.
- (ii) University examination fees, eligibility and enrolment fees etc. shall be as per University rules from time to time.

6. Examination Scheme, Curriculum & Related Regulations:

The curriculum, examination scheme and award of marks to theory, laboratory and projects will be as per 'General Rules and Regulations' approved by the Academic Statutory body of Faculty of Engineering.


7. Eligibility for the Award of the Degree:

Before awarding the degree a candidate must pass all the theory/ practical subjects. A candidate is said to be detained who falls short of attendance as per norms and who fails in any Class Work (CW)/Sessional Work (SW). He /She shall have to seek fresh admission in the subject whenever admission is available.

8. Attendance:

Attendance in theory and practical classes shall be compulsory. Minimum attendance for appearing in examinations is 75% in theory and practical separately.



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9. General Instructions:

- a. The candidate will be promoted to the available semester of the next academic year provided he/she does not carry a backlog of more than a combination of five theory and practical subjects (taken together) of the immediate previous year.
- b. A candidate will not be permitted to appear in the examination, which he/ she has passed earlier.
- c. A candidate, who has failed in more than five theory papers or a combination of more than five theory papers and practical subjects (taken together), will become ex-student of the Institute.
- d. A candidate should have no backlog of the lower class i.e. a candidate will not be admitted to the third year if he/she has failed in any subject (Theory or Practical) of the first year. Similarly he/she will not be admitted to the fourth year, if he/she has failed in any subject (Theory or Practical) of the second year.
- e. Candidate failing in any examination may, subject to other provisions of this ordinance, be readmitted to the examination in the failing subjects in the subsequent semester without necessarily prosecuting a further course of regular study in the institute.
- f. No candidate will be awarded degree of Bachelor of Engineering (B.E.) (PTDC) unless he/she has passed all the eight semester examinations. Final degree and mark sheet shall be awarded only after successful completion of the program i.e. after passing theory and practical examinations of all the semesters with minimum required Class work and Sessional work marks.
- g. The candidate, pursuing seventh semester after eighth semester (BA Group) will not be issued degree and mark-sheet or provisional degree certificate after eighth semester, until he/she has passed all the semester.
- h. With a view to avoid an accidental failure in an examination the following shall be observed:
 - (i) A maximum of only five marks shall be awarded to a candidate as grace marks in one theory in each semester examination, taken in full. No grace marks shall be awarded if examination is taken in part.
 - (ii) The grace marks so awarded shall not be added for the computation of the aggregate marks obtained in the semester.
 - (iii) After condoning the above deficiency the result shall be declared in the division to which the candidate is entitled with the provisions of this ordinance.
- i. For matters not covered in the ordinance or for any required modification, the Executive Council shall be the competent authority to decide.


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
